



QUINCY AREA PARTNERSHIP FOR INDIVIDUALS Funding Guidelines

The Quincy Area Partnership for Unmet Needs will be utilized to responsibly respond to the emergency needs of individuals and families in Adams County through a collaborative that utilizes the use of the Adams County Together-ACT funds, grants and other community resources.

1. No funding requests will be considered unless the completed application is on file at the United Way
2. All funding agents on the Unmet Needs committee have the freedom to operate under their own guidelines and parameters of the funding source they represent when funding requests are considered.
3. All funds awarded are considered a grant that is not expected to be repaid.
4. The use of all funds awarded is restricted to the use stated in the application.
5. Adams County, Illinois is the primary service area of the Quincy Area Partnership for Unmet Needs. All individuals receiving emergency assistance must be residents of Adams County and/or living in Adams County but are transient.
6. Proof of Insurance and driver's license is required for cases related to automobiles. The caseworker is not required to copy this information on every application, as long as verification is available at the meeting.
7. Clients who are eligible for food stamps and TANF - may be asked to enroll in these programs as part of their assistance.
8. All funding agents on the committee have the freedom to operate under their own guidelines (agencies) and belief systems (churches) when deciding whether to fund a case.
9. In an effort to be good stewards of donated dollars, the Unmet Needs committee generally does not provide funding for the following needs:
 - a. Court related fines and fees
 - b. Payday Loans
 - c. Payments to rent-to-own centers
 - d. Travel expenses other than for medical needs
10. All information given to the Solution Team Members will remain confidential.
11. The Unmet Needs Committee will adhere to all equal opportunity laws and mandates.

Funding Priorities

1. Emergency needs.
2. Utility assistance
3. Car Repairs
4. Payments for rent and mortgage.
5. Childcare payments.

Payments will be made to vendors not directly to the Individual.
