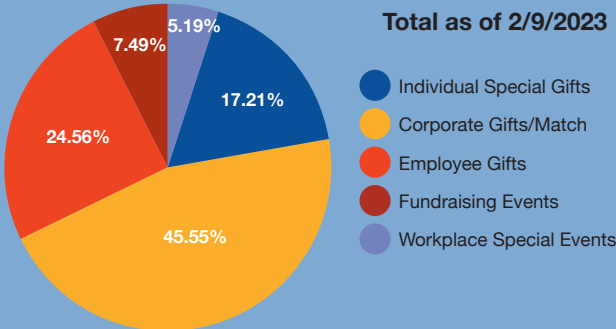

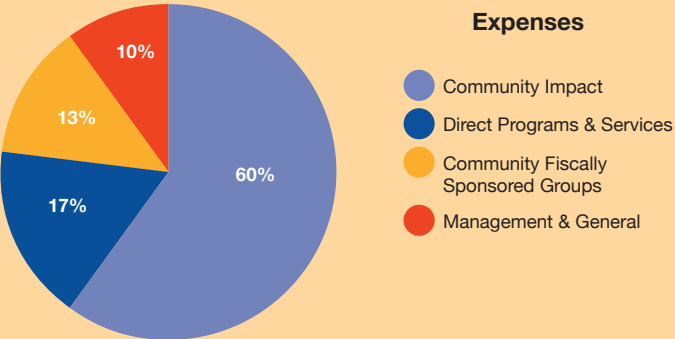

The Good News of Christmas campaign is a yearly event sponsored by the Herald-Whig and United Way of Adams County. The campaign enables selected individuals or families in need to enjoy the holidays. Since 1988, roughly \$1.79MM, along with hundreds of volunteer hours and services, have been donated to help over 1,530 families enjoy Christmas and thus enable them to get back on their feet. Each year families throughout the community of the Herald-Whig circulation area are selected to receive assistance based on needs outlined by their caseworkers.
