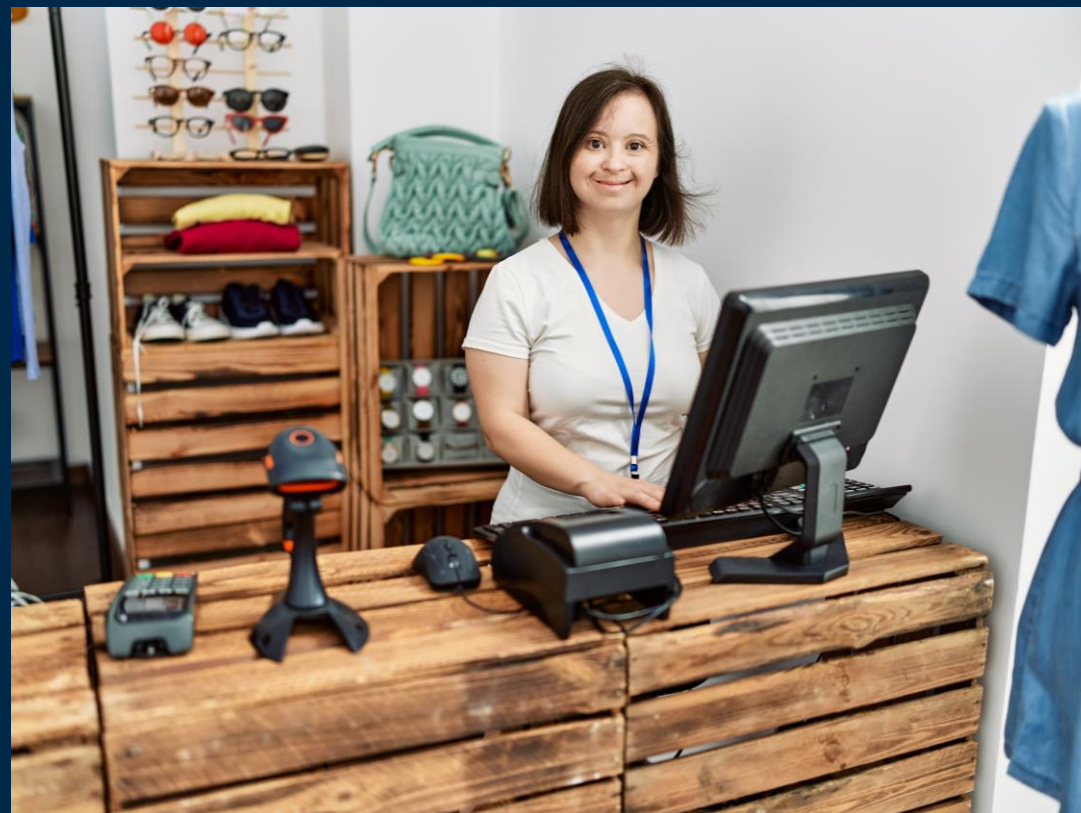


Individual Placement and Support (IPS)

IPS is a model of supported employment for people with symptoms of mental illness (e.g., depression, anxiety, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder) as well as individuals diagnosed with Autistic Disorder. IPS supported employment helps people living with behavioral health conditions work at regular jobs of their choosing. Mainstream education and technical training are included as ways to advance career paths. One does not need to receive services at Transitions to access IPS and it is free.

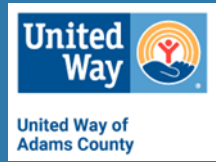
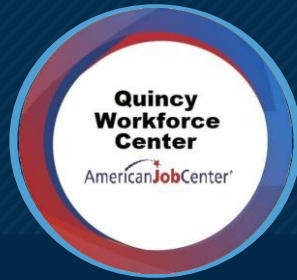

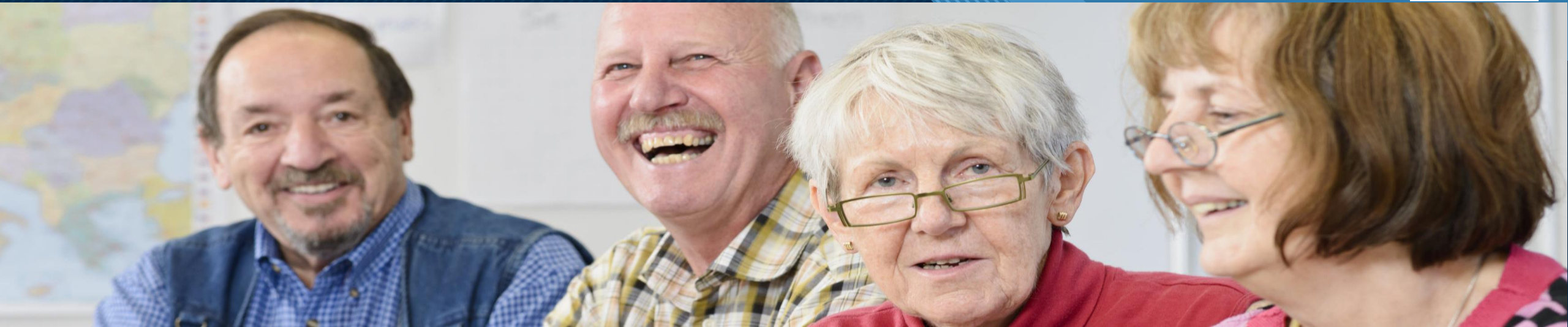
